Anajali High School News

Wellingtone, head teacher and founder of the Anajali School in Nairobi, Kenya, recently spent six weeks in the United States speaking in many different settings and raising both awareness and funds for Anajali. The Anajali School in the Kibera slum of Nairobi takes underprivileged children from age 3 through Class 8, but only those who have sponsors can ever get to high school. As the need for an Anajali High School became apparent, ten acres of land was located about 45 minutes from the Kibera Slum. A payment had been made on this land, but when Wellingtone came to the US in September there was an outstanding balance of \$36,000. By the time Wellingtone returned on October 25, the entire amount to pay the balance on the land had been received. This was not one big gift from a few donors, but many gifts from many individuals. We are filled with thanksgiving and praise for what God has done.

At the time of this writing, the first signing of papers in the Nairobi Land Office has taken place. The second (continued from page 1)

signing is December 9, 2011 and then the land office will issue the title deed so that construction can begin. The target date for opening the school has been set for

January 2013. Thank you for your part in this miracle.

The following is a note from Wellingtone written just before leaving the US for Kenya.


Dear Brothers and Sister in Christ,

because not even a single word can explain how happy I am.


I promise to work hard through out my campus life and do hope God will open for me ways and be able to make my dream a reality.
